World Vision is a Christian organisation dedicated to working with children, families, and their communities worldwide to reach their full potential by tackling the causes of poverty and injustice.

Education

Only 54 % of children complete five years of primary education. WVM prioritizes Early Childhood Care and Development for children aged 3 to 5 and creating an enabling environment for children at primary school by renovating school buildings, classrooms facilities, playgrounds, and safe water and sanitation systems. For out-of-school children aged between 8 to 18, WVM provides Non-formal education services and vocational training. These activities support WV's global goal of increasing the number of children who can read with comprehension by the age of 11.









Vulnerable Children

WVM protects vulnerable children by working to eliminate abuse, neglect, exploitation and all forms of violence. We provide awareness on the dangers of trafficking and support traffic survivors with reintegration assistance. We also actively work to help identify child soldiers and assist their transition out of military service and back to their communities. To help street children, we establish Drop-in Centers and temporary shelters to provide learning, health assistance, skilled vocational training and support children to reintegrate into a safe community environment.













Disaster Risk Reduction & Response



Our programme focus on community-level Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and emergency response. We work with World Food Program (WFP) to respond to critical food needs in four townships. We are a country lead in the ASEAN Agreement on Disaster Management and Emergency Response Project and we have endorsed and promoted the ASEAN Committee on Disaster Management Civil Society Organizations Partnership Framework.

Health, Nutrition & Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

Our approach to Maternal, Newborn Child Health and Nutrition (MNCHN) has a particular focus on the first 1,000 days, and identifies evidence-based, cost-effective community-based interventions for pregnant women and children aged 0-24 months. We work at the household, community, and township level to support and strengthen existing health structures. Key partners are the Ministry of Health at all levels and civil society organizations (CSOs).
