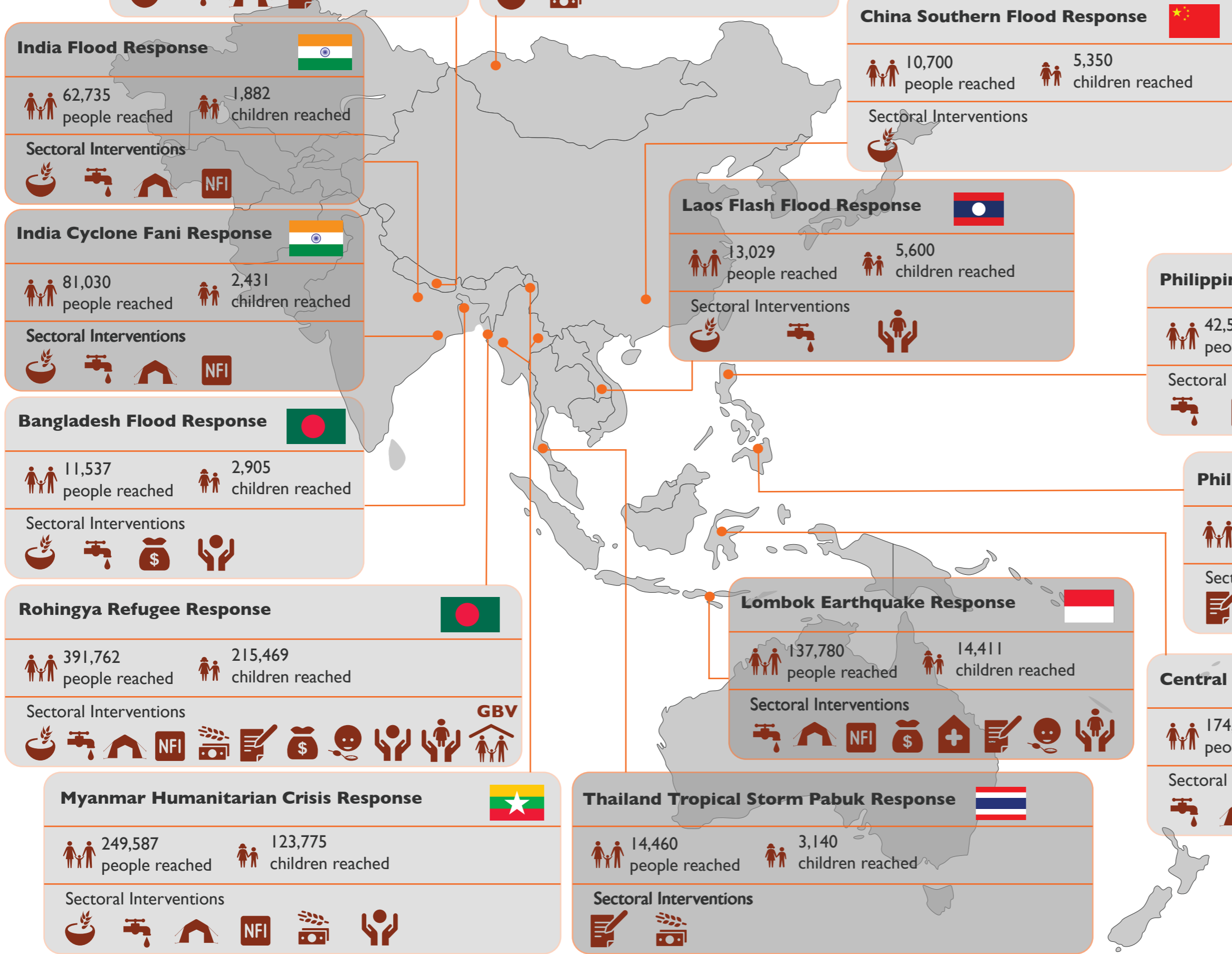

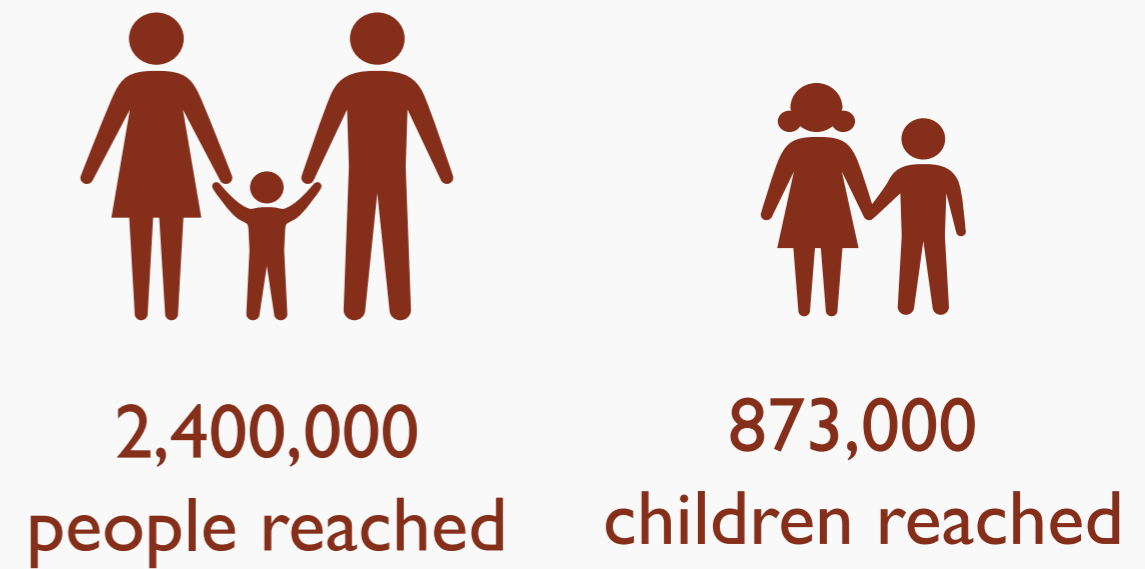


World Vision is working to protect the well-being of children and family impacted by natural and complex emergencies, along with strengthening household and community resilience.

As we deepen our commitment to the most vulnerable, in 2019, World Vision, within the Asia Pacific Region, has responded to 73 national and provincial level disasters (31 South Asia and Pacific and 42 East Asia). Through a multisectoral and evidence-based approach, emphasising on cash voucher programming, community accountability, gender sensitivity and inclusion, World Vision has reached nearly 2,400,000 people, including over 873,000 children.

With the complexity of responses increasing and the field realities becoming more dynamic, World Vision shifts to a more agile, responsive and integrated disaster management approach that embraces innovation and incorporates research, evidence-based programming and is supported by a comprehensive humanitarian policy and risk management procedures to ensure response effectiveness and quality of our programmatic interventions.

Guided by humanitarian standards, World Vision will continue to prepare and implement robust humanitarian response, rehabilitation and post-conflict programmes, and serve as an advocate for the vulnerable children and their communities.
