

Sudan has made significant progress in ensuring populations have access to basic water, sanitation and hygiene services and facilities. As at 2019, an estimated 73% of the population had access to safe water, 25% were practicing hand washing with soap, and 31% had access to basic sanitation, according to the Sudan SDG 6 Plan. The situation however remains dire among the most vulnerable populations, particularly in areas that have experienced significant influx of internally displaced persons, refugees and returnees.

Intervention

World Vision has been working closely with local NGO partners Government to address some of the critical gaps in water infrastructure, basic sanitation facilities and hygiene services.

Strategic goal

To increase access to safe water, improved sanitation and proper hygiene for vulnerable populations is one of World Vision's key strategic objectives.
