





## World Vision's **Key Concerns**

D We urge the world to unite to focus on the most vulnerable children, especially refugees and displaced children.

Secondary effects of the crisis on children are putting at least 30 million children's lives at risk, but there are things we can do now to help ease the risks.

> Children will need special support now – including psychosocial – to reduce anxiety and stress during and after this crisis.

Joining hands with faith and community leaders is critical to strengthen preparedness, to effect behaviour change and to protect children.

- World Vision has provided input to the first and second round of the UN Global Humanitarian Response Plan (GHRP) at the global and field level highlighting vulnerable groups, particularly children and reporting on primary and secondary COVID-19 impacts on children.
- World Vision has been working closely with WFP and other partners on key operational issues and to ensure logistics funding as part of the Global Humanitarian Response Plan.
- World Vision contributed to recommendations on cash transfers and social protection as central tools for COVID-19 through the Grand Bargain Cash Workstream.
- At the EU, World Vision along with partners is working to ensure the EU Green Deal (EGD) is employed as a vehicle to support bounce back from COVID-19.
