





## World Vision's **Key Concerns**

- We urge the world to stand together with the most vulnerable children to fight COVID-19, especially refugees and the internally displaced.
- Devastating aftershocks of the crisis are putting at least 30 million children's lives at risk. We urgently need to address both the direct health impacts of the virus and the secondary impacts brought about by viral containment measures.
  - Children will need special support now – including psychosocial – to reduce anxiety and stress during and after this crisis.
- Joining hands with faith and community leaders is critical to strengthen preparedness, to effect behaviour change and to protect children.



- Provided recommendations at the national and global level for the second iteration of the UN's Global Humanitarian Response Plan, which was launched on 7 May.
- Working with OCHA on a range of operational issues including medevac services for NGO staff, counterterror sanctions, and the collapse of the health care system in Venezuela.
- Partnering with UNICEF on a number of fronts including technical guidance on the continuity of child reintegration programing for children associated with armed forces and groups.
- World Vision Haiti used its monitoring data to influence the humanitarian response to migrants returning from the Dominican Republic.

In El Salvador, Guatemala, Mexico, Senegal, Mali, Kenya and beyond, the Joining Forces alliance, of which World Vision is a member, is increasing awareness and advocating with national authorities on protecting children during COVID-19, including issues such as social protection programmes and protocols for the protection of children.
