# WORLD VISION VENEZUELA: priorities and capacity

WV Venezuela currently has operations in the states of Táchira, Carabobo, Anzoátegui, Miranda and the Capital District (Caracas). We operate through a growing network of partners including faith-based organizations, local humanitarian organizations, community-based organizations, and churches.thin Venezuela.

WV Venezuela has already created a response team within Venezuela and developed operations in five geographical areas thanks to the alliances that have been established with other faith-based organizations. With help from our global support team, we conducted a multi-sector assessment in five states, something that has not been achieved by any other NGO within Venezuela.

· 294 Adults and Church leaders have received training in humanitarian standards, MEAL, and cash and voucher assistance in order to better serve the communities they work with.



#### Program area: Faith and Development

• The Hope Without Borders network has been established through an alliance with FBOs and churches to reach the most vulnerable communities. To date. alliances have been established with 6 FBOs that will allow us to reach different communities in the states. of Apure, Bolivar, Guarico, Lara, Miranda and Zulia.

# Program area: COVID-19 Response

• WV Venezuela has been working closely with our local partners to provide food assistance through inkind donations and cash transfers, and WASH assistance through filters and water storage containers to the most vulnerable communities. To date, we have provided 1,955 people with water, sanitation and hygiene services.
