Government Directives

- Thailand and Laos borders remain closed to Cambodia, while the ban on cross-border movement between Cambodia and Vietnam have lifted.
- All public schools remain closed till late November 2020.
- Ban on all religious gatherings in the country, effective on 17 March
- Ban all activities or meetings with more than 50 people (17 March)
- The Government has decided to charge 3,000\$ deposit for all foreign visitors for guarantine and tests.

- Revised the Response Activities of WVI- C response plan to align within the updated Global COVER result framework. The objectives, outputs, indicators and activities align with the Global COVER Framework.
- World Vision COVID-19 Rapid Assessment report produced and circulated to the Civil Society, Community, Government and Multi-Inter-agencies and donors.
- Guideline of Education and Child Protection Technical Programme Integration for COVID-19 Response was developed and shared with field staff.
- WV teams continue to produce social media messaging on positive parenting and home-based learning.
- WVI- C applies the Government COVID-19 prevention and protection standards.
- All staff were provided with masks, sanitizers and liquid soap. Flexible work applied and staff are encouraged to practice protection measures and social distancing.
