


Overview of South Kordofan State Programme

Background

World Vision started operations in South Kordofan state in 2018, as part of its expansion strategy to go to where the need is the greatest. World Vision has operations in 14 out of the 17 localities, directly reaching the most vulnerable children through: water sanitation and hygiene (WASH), nutrition, health, food security and livelihoods including food assistance, and child protection.

Since 2020, Our interventions have also incorporated to provide covid-19 preventive messages and supplies, as part of mitigating the spread of the virus as well as minimise infection. Our interventions target internally displaced populations, returnees, refugees, as well as vulnerable residents.

By 2025, World Vision hopes to have directly reached 441,838 most vulnerable children, nearly 40% of the total number of children in the state.

Health & Nutrition

Our interventions mainly focus on:

- Rehabilitation of health facilities providing primary health care services.
- Motivating MoH staff through incentives attending to increased demand for health consultation.
- Providing health referral services targeting refugees.
- Screening for, and management of malnutrition through the Outpatient Therapeutic Programmes (OTPs) and Targeted
- Supplementary Feeding Programmes (TFSPs).
- Community Management of Acute Malnutrition (CMAM) and referrals to health facilities.
- Capacity building of community and Ministry of Health on screening and management of malnutrition.

Our interventions mainly focus on:

- Provision of food assistance in the form of general food distribution targeting vulnerable internally displaced persons, refugees and host communities, funded by WFP.
- Planned school meal programmes targeting vulnerable children in schools.
- Distribution of agricultural inputs including seeds and small implements.
- Equipping farmers with training and skills



Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

Our interventions mainly focus on:

- Increasing access to water infrastructure, sanitation facilities.
- Rehabilitation of Hafirs also known as water pans.
- Rehabilitation of broken water hand pumps and boreholes.
- Upgrading boreholes to solar-powered systems.
- Innovating sustainable cost-recovery water supply systems.
- Construction of Ventilated Improved Pit (VIP) latrines in schools and health facilities.
- Hygiene promotion, education and covid-19 awareness.



Our interventions mainly focus on:

- Protection
- SGBV
- PSEA awareness creating
- Capacity building for community and government

COLLABORATIONS AND PARTNERSHIPS

We coordinate closely with government through its institutions such as the relevant line ministries such as the State level Ministry of Health, and the Humanitarian Aid Commission (HAC).

We are continuously engaging with our various local NGO partners in the state on planning and designing of projects, and implementation of our day-to-day activities across the different sectors. This ranges from facilitating community mobilisation and disseminating messages to communities about the programmes being implemented, conducting trainings and monitoring of field activities. Our goal is to ensure that we are building the capacity of local partners to ensure project activities run smoothly even after project phase out.
