These solar powered piped water schemes have led to the establishment of nutrition gardens, enabling communities to grow different crop varieties.

World Vision Zimbabwe, has invested considerable resources in making groundwater visible through surveying, drilling, borehole development and mechanisation to lift, store and distribute groundwater for multiple uses. This improvement in access to clean, safe and adequate water to communities, schools and healthcare facilities has transformed lives of people especially women, children and people with disabilities in the country.

Solar Powered Piped Water Schemes established in Schools, Communities & Health Care Facilities between 2017 & 2021



Solar powered piped water schemes have enabled communities to grow nutritious crops throughout the year.



Improved safe and adequate water has enabled best hygiene practices such as increased frequency of washing hands among children.

A total of **1,165** water points were established, benefitting **965,000** people with basic water supply between 2017 & 2021
