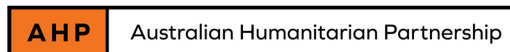

FACTS

- Papua New Guinea (PNG) is ranked as the 9th country with the highest disaster risk rating globally as of 2021.
- The population affected by river flooding and its economic damages is projected to double by 2030.
- Degradation of natural resources, including water sources, and shifts in the viable ranges for plant and animal species potentially reduce agricultural yields and accelerate the decline of the country's unique ecosystems.

World Vision International – Papua New Guinea works in close partnership government and local partners to empower people in low-lying, inland, and coastal communities through improved livelihoods to counter climate change and address the climate-induced food insecurity.



KEY INTERVENTIONS

Climate change adaptation and community-based disaster risk management

Strengthen the capacity of communities and government through risk mapping and disaster preparedness in case of increased frequency and severity of climate disasters

Increase awareness and knowledge of climate change and climate disaster risks among children, schools and communities

Climate-sensitive water, sanitation and hygiene

Improve systems of water supply, treatment, storage, water resource management, and climate change resilience by installing and rehabilitating water management systems

Actively exploring alternative technology (e.g. solar pumps for boreholes), as well as incorporate climate risk management into WASH activities for communities

Climate-smart livelihoods

Incorporate resilient and sustainable farming practices, nature-based livelihood practices, and climate-resilient food crops a holistic approach to improve livelihoods in communities

Introduce savings and financial literacy training as a disaster risk reduction mechanism

AHP COVID-19 response project

Support communities to increase food security and income by planting superfoods while reinforcing their awareness, and thus prevention, of COVID-19 outbreak and gender-based violence

NOTABLE PROJECTS

AHP Disaster READY programme

Provides training on climate change adaption and improve access to weather information for farmers and communities to make timely decisions and plans

Improve farmers' access to more resilient hybrid clones of cocoa seedling and provide them with training and support in integrated pest management

Bougainville economic and health resilience

Provide agricultural training that incorporates topics of climate change, improved farming practices, and resilient crop varieties
