About the Program of Scale Partners for a Malaria-Free Zambia (PoS PMFZ) Project

The Programs of Scale (PoS), a 3-year project with USD 2 million funding each from Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, Rotary International and World Vision United States, aims at supporting the scaling up of Integrated Community Case Management (iCCM+) in 10 districts in Central and Muchinga Province, respectively of the Republic of Zambia.

The PoS Project's primary outcomes are:

- Reduced cases of malaria, especially severe malaria and deaths, in PoS districts by 2024
- iCCM+ PoS sustained under Zambian Government management and financing

Key Activities

Systems Strengthening

Monitored functionalities of **1,521** Neighbourhood Health Committees through health centre committee (HCC) meetings

Social and Behaviour Change (SBC)

- Conducted a knowledge, attitudes and practices (KAP) survey among 4,000 individuals sampled from 2,000 households
- Facilitated **110** drama performances in Central and Muchinga Provinces to sensitise communities about malaria prevention, control and elimination
- Conducted orientation of **192** faith leaders, traditional, and civic leaders in malaria prevention, control, and elimination


Data Management

- Conducted data quality audits in 80 health facilities in Muchinga Province, in collaboration with PMI PAMO Plus, and 44 health facilities in Central Province
- Conducted monitoring and technical supportive supervision in
 7 health facilities in Mpika district


Malaria Rapid Reporting Indicators

Community Health Worker Saturation

Numbers of trained CHWs in PMFZ-supported districts, as of 30th November 2022. (*In case you didn't know:* A district is saturated when it attains a ratio of 1 CHW to 500 community members.)



Rapid Reporting Statistics, from 1st August 2021 to 30th November 2022. (*In case you didn't know:* Passive cases are those detected when a patient visits a CHW or a health facility, and active cases are those detected when CHWs actively follow up cases in their communities.)



Total number of Tests, Positives, Treatments and Referrals by CHWs, from 1st August 2021 to 30th November 2022
