To significantly improve child well-being by enabling families and communities to achieve sustainable access to adequate potable water, improved sanitation facilities, and good hygiene practices.

WASH BASE FUNDING

- (a) It is primarily a conservative fund and it can be considered as matching funds for other grants.
- S Funding is allocated to the national office based on their current capacity and existing resources to implement comprehensive WASH projects.
- Providing support to implement WASH business plan in line with WVI's national strategy and technical design documents.
- This budget can be used for hiring, capacity building, and retaining core WASH team for the national office.
- Recuting quality integrated WASH projects.

EXPECTED OUTPUTS (five-year plan)



KEY INTERVENTIONS:

- **Community-Led Total Sanitation (CLTS):** A set of activities to promote latrines for defecation at the community level, implemented in co-ordination with the community stakeholders.
- **Improving the access to water:** Mobilising the communities to create and improve access, and ensure sustained supply to clean drinking water.
- **Promoting WASH in Primary School:** Working with the school authorities and community stakeholders to improve WASH infrastructure in primary schools and to empower students to be agents of change.
- **Promoting WASH in Health Care Facilities:** Working with the Health Center Management Committees to improve WASH infrastructure and promote WASH practices in health centres and health posts.
