OUR FY22 IMPACT



EDUCATION

Children are equipped with literacy, numeracy and life skills

- **10,124** children benefitted from the Early Childhood Education and Support Program
- 462 Early Childhood Care and Development teachers trained
- **15,501** primary school children benefitted from 165 reading clubs
- **402** facilitators trained on how to operate reading clubs
- **29,835** parents trained in parental education including mental health and psycho-social support
- **15,380** primary school children participated in the unlock literacy program to improve their reading skills
- **3,719** children received education support such as reading materials, learning kits, and toys



- **4,823** households supported to maintain their food security through the Community Food Bank
- **8,374** households received farm inputs, livestock assistances and agriculture and livestock training
- **2,597** households received seeds for home gardening, benefitting **12,348** family members
- **170** households received water-saving micro-irrigation facilities to increase crop production and income
- **1,113** households supported to access water for drinking and domestic use
- **1,579** Savings for Transformation groups formed with **35,000** members, benefitting **38,576** children
- **553** youths provided technical and vocational training to improve their small businesses and increase their income
- **1,252** people trained in basic business development, of which **575** households received cash grants to start small businesses



DISASTER RISK REDUCTION & RESPONSE Communities receive food and cash support, and are equipped with knowledge on how to respond to disasters

- 6,441.714 metric tons of food and USD 1,575,260.69 in cash reached 79,808 people, including pregnant and lactating mothers and 17,771 under-five children
- 87.420 metric tons of soap reached 58,601 people



HEALTH, NUTRITION & WASH

Children and communities have access to better healthcare services and clean water

- **624** health committees formed, covering 90.43% of the targeted villages
- **171,523** people, including mothers and caregivers of under-five children, received health knowledge about maternal, infant, nutrition, and young child feeding
- **1,145** community health volunteers trained in infant and young child feeding counseling
- **3,514** clean delivery kits distributed to 6,346 pregnant women
- **3,623** newborn kits distributed
- **1,454** pregnant women referred and supported for emergency needs
- **929** under-five children referred for medical emergency and malnutrition
- 5,488 under-five children received special nutritious food
- **7,789** pregnant and lactating women received micronutrient tablets
- 14,655 under-five children received micronutrient powders
- **238** children under-five children with severe acute malnutrition and **879** children with moderate acute malnutrition treated
- 13,374 people accessed clean drinking water
- 911 people accessed sanitation facilities



CHILD PROTECTION Children grow up in a safe and protected environment free from all forms of violence

- 105,427 people, including 50,320 children, received child protection, child participation, and child rights awareness
- **70,985** people, including **62,576** children, received online awareness training about child-safe
- **14,998** children trained in life skills
- **33,955** parents and caregivers received training in celebrating families and positive parenting disciplines
- **621** community-based child protection groups formed with **7,220** members
- 642 child and youth groups formed with 13,889 members
- **845** community volunteers trained on safe migration, human trafficking, and legal process
- **1,358** people received awareness of safe migration
- **1,075** migrant households supported with basic food items covering **5,858** people
- **10** children and young people participated at regional and global level platforms and discussed issues on violence against children and climate change



IT TAKES A WORLD (ITAW) CAMPAIGN Children are protected from physical violence both at home and school

- **1.3** million children benefitted through the policy implementation related to ending violence against children
- 5 winners awarded prizes for the ITAW theme songwriting competition, cooperated with Myanmar Baptist
- 15 Early Childhood Care and Development Centers committed to creating violence-free learning spaces for children
