The conflict in Ukraine on 24th of Feb 2022 has caused the world's fastest growing displacement crisis since World War II, leaving at least:



- 18 million People in urgent need of humanitarian assistance in Ukraine
- 5.9 million Refugees from Ukraine recorded across Europe
- 5.1 million Internally displaced people

Deliver inclusive, need driven humanitarian assistance to refugees, IDPs and the most vulnerable children and their families in Ukraine, Romania, Moldova and Georgia.



People reached by Sector:

- Food Security 31% II Multi-purpose cash - 24%
- III NFIs- 19%
- IV Education 17% V Protection – 8% VI Livelihoods - 0.4%



World Vision UCR:

- Works with 46 partners & 20 donors;
- Operates in 24 regions in Ukraine, 17 in Romania. 34 in Moldova, and 4 in Georgia.
- 46,523 people reached during the reporting period, which accounts to 3.4% of $the\,overall\,people\,reached\,to$ date;
- In the reporting period has reached people in:
- Ukraine 30,890 (66% of the overall people reached in July 2023),
- Romania 3,707 (8%),
- Moldova 11,276 (24%),
- Georgia 650 (2%);
- Children account for 49% of the overall people reached.
