PROMOTION OF YOUTH SKILLS AND EMPLOYABILITY (PYSE)

PROJECT GOAL

Select and support the most vulnerable youth between 15 and 25 years old with vocational training, on the job training, and relevant life skills to increase access to decent and productive employment opportunities and ensure demand-driven skills and career decisions meet market demands.

Timeline: 1 December 2023 to 31 May 2025

DEVELOPMENT CONTEXT

Based on the youth situation analysis in Cambodia carried out by UNFPA¹ and Ministry of Education Youth and Sport (MOEYS) 41% of the employed young people respondents, aged 15–24, had left school or finished formal education, and 59% of the total were not in Employment, Education, or Training (NEET).

CHALLENGES

The biggest challenges to youth employment in Cambodia include, but are not limited to:

- **Lack of skills**: Youth have only a low level of technical skills for market demand-driven jobs in both formal and informal sectors.
- **Rural-urban migration:** Many young, unskilled people migrate to urban areas in search of jobs because of the limited or declining job opportunities in rural areas.

PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION AREAS

12 Khan/districts: Doun Penh, Chamkar Mon, Boeng Keng Kang, Toul Kouk, Russie Keo, Chroy Changvar, Sen Sok, Prek Pnov, Dongkor, Chbar Ompov, Mean Chey, and Por Senchey.

PROJECT TARGET

215 individuals between 15 and 25 years old (50% of the selected youth will be from registered child families, and another 50% will be from other vulnerable households).
