- •1 shipment comprising of 7968 notebooks to schools and 83 bicycles.
- •1 shipment comprising of 288 mattresses distributed to low cost boarding schools and Children's homes.
- •1 shipment comprising of 16648 Backpacks to schools
- •82950 toys distributed to schools

### Impact

•Donated furniture helped create a comfortable and conducive learning environment, promoting better focus, engagement, and academic performance. Adequate and comfortable furniture helped to reduce distractions, promote better behavior, and encourage learners to develop good study habits.

•Donated mattresses provided essential support to vulnerable learners through enhancing sleep quality, leading to better rest, relaxation, and rejuvenation. This, in turn, improved cognitive function, concentration, and overall well-being of students

•Notebooks provided learners with a dedicated space to take notes, complete assignments, and organize their thoughts which led to better retention of information, improved understanding of concepts

•The backpacks provided learners with the necessary tools and resources to participate fully in their educational activities, promoting greater access to learning opportunities. Backpacks can be a significant expense for many families, particularly those from low-income backgrounds. The donation helped alleviate this financial burden, allowing families to allocate resources to other essential needs.

#### **GIK** Beneficiaries: Estimated to be 55,793.

**Impact**: To support clinics in the refugee camp and surroundings and District Hospitals, enhanced project funding, stronger partnerships, and increased organizational visibility and credibility. The donated medical accessories were more than just supplies – they were a symbol of compassion and solidarity. They represented the recognition that the people in refugee camp were not alone, that there were those who cared about their well-being and were willing to act.

### Food Security and Resilience; Ity and Resili GIK Beneficiaries: 32,765.

**Impact**: Toys provided emotional comfort and stress relief for children affected by food insecurity, promoting their psychological well-being and resilience. Enhanced life skills to the youth and motivational tools for volunteers. Bicycles helped to facilitate the movement of agricultural workers between fields, farms, and markets, promoting more efficient use of labor and resources. Tiles improved accessibility for people with disabilities, ensuring that both offices and child-friendly spaces are inclusive and equitable. Easy-to-clean tiles also simplified maintenance tasks, reducing the time and resources spent on cleaning and upkeep.

• Shipments comprising of 20 pallets of ceramic tiles for refurbishing an AP office and a newly constructed child friendly space at sub office.


