BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- Globally, Africa is the only region where the number of children under 5 years with stunting has increased. East Africa has the highest rates, with 34.5%¹
- In Elgeyo Marakwet (Kenya), Nugaal (Somalia) und Shinyanga DC und Kishapu (Tanzania) respectively:
 - 3,2%², 14%³ and 3,6%⁴ are wasted 0
 - 32,9%², 9,8%³ and 30,3%⁴ are stunted 0
 - 14,9%², 10%³ and 22.9%⁴ receive the Minimum Dietary 0 Diversitv
 - 24,7%², 10,2%³ and 13,1%⁴ of children aged 6-23 months 0 receive minimum acceptable diet

APPROACH & OBJECTIVES

- **Overall Outcome:** An enabling policy and structural environment is leading to the improved health and nutrition status of boys, girls, women, and men in Kenya, Tanzania and Somalia
- Outcome Module 1 (Macro-level): Target country governments implement updated national action plans consistent with AU nutrition policy
- Outcome Module 2 (Meso-level): improved gender-sensitive nutrition and health services
- Outcome Module 3 (Micro-level): improved gender-sensitive production and use of nutritious foods
- Outcome Module 4 (Networks and partnerships): improved gender-sensitive health and nutrition services, through sustained advocacy of local civil society organizations
- Project Models: Citizen Voice & Action, Positive Deviance Hearth, Infant & Young Child Feeding, VSLA, Men-Care, etc.

WHO DOES THE PROJECT TARGET?

- Macro-level: national governments, UN, African organisations
- Meso-level: sub-national authorities, health personnel, voluntary community health workers
- **Micro-level:** 506.898 direct beneficiaries (173,911 women and 189.785 children) and 666,488 indirect beneficiaries
 - Pregnant and lactating women
 - People living with disabilities
 - Male and female farmers
 - Members of community groups
 - Influential people e.g. religious leaders
