Brief Overview

Since 2011, the Ministry of Health (MISAU) and civil society partners, World Vision (Main Recipient), the Foundation for Community Development (FDC), Food for The Hungry Association (FHA) and Aid for Development from People to People (ADPP), have been implementing the Program for Accelerating and Strengthening the Quality of Malaria Control Interventions in Mozambique.

- In 2024 this Program trained 6,460 community volunteers trained as community dialogue Facilitators.
- To ensure community access to at least one method of malaria prevention in Mozambique, it distributed more than 11.4 million treated mosquito nets and covered 2.8 million households.
- To share experiences and perspectives as well as resource mobilization to strengthen the fight against malaria, it conducted four sessions in the provinces of Cabo Delgado, Niassa, Nampula, Sofala and Manica.
- For Community awareness-raising activities on malaria prevention, the program reached more than 7 million people in 90 districts the equivalent to 37% of the covered area
