143 Faith Leaders trained to:

Promote values of protection and
human dignity



Media Engagement

71 journalists and editors trained
on: The role of media in protecting
human rights, ethical reporting on
cases of human trafficking and
raising public awareness on human
trafficking



Community Engagement

79645 people reached with
information on identifying human
trafficking red flags and indicators, as
well as the procedures and channels
for reporting suspected cases.
14,912 community members reached
through community dialogues



Auxiliary Social Workers (ASW)

38 ASWs trained on
providing social support and services
to people at risk, conduct case
management for victims of human
trafficking, facilitate follow-up and
referral to appropriate services



Support for Victims

57 victims of human trafficking
identified and supported through:
Business skills training for
self-sufficiency
Provision of start-up materials for
income-generating activities.



Child Protection Teams

576 members of Community Council Child
Protection Teams (CCCPTs) trained on
raising public awareness on TIP, Safeguard
children and community members ,
promote reporting and facilitate access to
protection and support services for victims
and survivors of human trafficking.



Law Enforcement

525 police officers trained on enhancing
law enforcement responses to human
trafficking, strengthen identification and
referral of cases , build capacity to manage
cases effectively, improve support services
for victims of human trafficking
