

A MESSAGE FROM OUR REGIONAL LEADER



In 2024, the intertwined challenges of conflict, climate change, and economic uncertainty continued to heighten vulnerability for children and families across West and Central Africa. Yet, by God's grace and through collective action, World Vision reached more than 13.9 million people with life-saving and sustainable support.

Together, we strengthened health and nutrition services for 5.2 million people, provided clean water to and improved hygiene and sanitation for 1.9 million people, and reached 2.4 million people through our emergency response work. Our child protection work helped ensure that more than 1.5 million children were safeguarded from harm. In addition, our education, livelihoods, and faith-based initiatives restored hope and resilience to millions across the 9 countries where World Vision works directly, plus 2 more countries where we worked through partners.

Equally vital, our advocacy efforts strengthened child protection systems and amplified young voices, helping shape policies that will positively impact more than 16 million people.

These achievements were made possible through the dedication of our staff and the steadfast support of our partners, donors, and communities. Together, we are transforming and empowering lives.



IMPACT SPOTLIGHT

Adapting for impact and resilience in Burkina Faso

In 2024, World Vision operated in the four most fragile regions affected by insecurity in Burkina Faso: Boucle du Mouhoun, Sahel, North, and Centre-North regions. Due to increased vulnerabilities in urban and peri-urban areas, we extended our interventions to the Center region through an urban programming approach to support displaced people and host communities. To enhance our effectiveness, we adopted a thoughtful localisation and access strategy with innovative procedures sensitive to fragile contexts, such as a hybrid implementation approach combining direct and indirect interventions.

Fostering child-driven transformation in Central African Republic

In the lead-up to the Nutrition for Growth Summit in March 2025, World Vision's inaugural Children's Nutrition Dialogue in Central African Republic was a pivotal event. It provided a platform for young people to express their views on healthy eating and contribute to the fight against malnutrition. This insightful event highlighted the importance of engaging children in combatting malnutrition and shaping future strategies.

Responding to unprecedented crisis in Chad

In 2024, the conflict in Sudan became the world's largest child displacement crisis, with a record 3.5 million children fleeing. Hundreds to thousands of these children and their families have been crossing the border into Chad daily. Since the conflict began in 2023, World Vision has reached more than 1.8 million people, mostly women and children, with emergency assistance, including health and nutrition services and water, sanitation, and hygiene solutions.

Scaling up health for 1 million children in Ghana

With the new Healthy Environment and Wellness (HEAL) Technical Programme, World Vision scaled up interventions to protect 1 million of the most vulnerable girls and boys in Ghana from infection and disease by 2025, through improved access to WASH and healthcare services.

Partnering for inclusive services in Mauritania

World Vision identified a critical gap in disability inclusion in Mauritania, where people with disabilities continue to face systemic barriers to full participation. By mobilising government, civil society, and other partners, we laid the foundation for rights-based, disability-inclusive programming that will shape our 2026–2030 strategy and expand equitable access to services.



30 years of lasting transformation in Niger

In 2024, World Vision celebrated three decades of impact in Niger partnering with communities to transform lives and create brighter futures for children and families nationwide. Over the past year alone, more than 1.5 million people have benefited from our integrated programmes across the country spanning health, education, clean water, and child protection.
