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


Snapshot: World Vision South Sudan

75 years of global service: World Vision is a Christian humanitarian, development, and advocacy organisation committed to working with children, families, and communities to help them reach their full potential by addressing the root causes of poverty and injustice.

40 years serving Sudan and South Sudan: Operating in South Sudan since 1989, World Vision implements programs in food security and livelihoods, education, peacebuilding and protection, and integrated health, nutrition, and WASH (water, sanitation, and hygiene).

World Vision maintains zonal offices in Upper Nile, Warrap, Northern Bahr el Ghazal, and Western Equatoria, alongside its national office in Juba.





2026-2030 Strategic Direction

South Sudan's fragile context—marked by extreme deprivation, violence, and disasters—continues to undermine the well-being of children, families, and communities. In response, World Vision South Sudan's FY26–30 strategy aims to "Transform the lives of 5 million most vulnerable children in South Sudan by 2030" through direct programme interventions and advocacy.

Our Promise #1: **Peaceful and Nurturing Relationships**

Children experience positive, peaceful, and supportive relationships within their families and communities.

Sustained peacebuilding and social cohesion are vital for South Sudan's future. Partnering with community structures and faith-based actors—especially through the South Sudan Council of Churches—will be key. As the country manages the return and reintegration of refugees, returnees, and IDPs, peace and reconciliation efforts will be critical to advancing child wellbeing and national development.

- Empowering children and youth as peacebuilders
- Strengthening community-based institutions for peacebuilding and social cohesion
- Mainstreaming of peacebuilding and conflict-sensitive approaches in all WV programming









Our Promise #2: Improved Child Nutrition

Children enjoy improved nutrition, with a marked reduction in the prevalence of undernutrition.

Ending child malnutrition requires an integrated, multi-sectoral approach that tackles immediate needs and root causes. Children need nutritious food, clean water, quality health services, and nurturing care, while families need diversified livelihoods. Long-term resilience through climatesmart practices, resource management, disaster risk reduction, and peacebuilding ensures stronger households and sustained improvements in child nutrition

- Improving household dietary intake through quality health and nutrition services, including maternal and child health programs
- Increasing household income through Building Secured Livelihoods, Saving for Transformation, and skills development models, among others
- · Strengthening community resilience to climate shocks









Our Promise #3: Protection from Violence & Exploitation

Children are safe, protected from all forms of violence, abuse, and exploitation.

Ending violence and exploitation against children by empowering them to protect themselves and strengthening families to provide safe, nurturing environments. This includes promoting positive cultural norms, advocating for stronger legal frameworks, and mobilising resources for child protection. Through community engagement and resilience-building, safer spaces can be created where children can thrive, learn, and actively participate in their own development.

- Promoting children's rights, participation, and inclusion through Education in Emergencies, child friendly spaces, and school meals, among others
- Strengthening families' capacity to provide quality care and protection to children
- Enhancing communities' capacity to adopt positive cultural and social norms
- Advocating and strengthening legal and policy frameworks









Our Promise #4: Improved Health for Children Under 5

Children under five achieve better health outcomes and overall wellbeing.

Integrating Health, Nutrition, and WASH is essential for improving the health of children under five. Combining these sectors ensures children receive comprehensive care—access to primary health services, proper nutrition, clean water, and hygiene. Training caregivers and community health workers to promote positive behaviors strengthens community health systems and creates a sustained, lasting impact on child survival and development.


- Ensuring children under 5 are well nourished through Community-based Management of Acute Malnutrition and Maternal Infant and Young Children Nutrition models
