Major achievements of Sponsorship and PNS Projects

Nutrition and Resilient Livelihoods

- **2,101** farmers/people from **112** producers and saving groups formed to strengthen knowledge and skills in local value chain development and financial accessibility.
- **1,076** farmers of producer groups capacitated to improve production and increase income.
- **579** most vulnerable families affected by disasters supported with skills-based training and business start-up materials.
- **494** individuals supported improving the business startup for alternative livelihood opportunities.
- 286 individuals capacitated with knowledge and skills of income generation.
- **217** farmers capacitated with knowledge and skills of climate resilient agriculture techniques.
- **163** most vulnerable families are trained in vocational training to promote economic development.
- 25 Disaster Risk Management (DRM) Committees formed at community level, ward level and local level and trained them to prepare for disasters and early warning systems.

Our progress in this strategic cycle

Proportion of Ultra Poor Group households where women report to taking part in household decision making, e.g. buying of an asset, improved by **25.06%**. (Baseline value 54.14, Endline value 79.20)

Number and Percentage of households with the means to save money using a bank or credit union, increased by 22.27%. (Baseline value 71.93, Endline value 94.20)

Proportion of households with sufficient diet diversity, increased by 20.46%. (Baseline value 67.64, Endline value 88.10)

Proportion of households who faced a disaster but were able to recover and now live at the level they did before, increased by 8.5% (Baseline value 87.78, Endline value 96.28)

Proportion of women who report being involved in decisions on how to spend their income in the last three months, improved by 19.06%. (Baseline value 76.84, Endline value 95.90)

- **96.4%** of boys and girls reported having positive and peaceful relations with their Parent(s)/Caregiver(s) in Urban AP, whereas overall, **85.8%** of them reported from WVI Nepal's working areas.
- 93.5% of boys and girls reported having positive and peaceful relations with peers in Urban AP, whereas overall 77.8% of them reported from WVI Nepal's working areas.
- 2.3% of urban adolescents reported experiencing physical attacks in the past 12 months, whereas overall, 7.1% of them reported from WVI Nepal's working areas.

BRICKK and PROTECT (PNS) projects

- **2,372** most vulnerable children supported with educational materials to continue their school education.
- **1,468** children of brick workers enrolled in Day care centers where nutritious food was provided. (80% of them in day care centers feel safer and protected in Final evaluation carried out in 2024 as compared to Baseline evaluation i.e. 64%)
- **521** households linked to Government Health Insurance scheme to minimize the occupational risk in the brick industries.
- 142 children who were engaged in child labour in the brick industries and other sectors reintegrated. (60% of them have continued their school education as per Final evaluation 2024.)
- **163** people from most vulnerable families provided vocational training to foster skilled workforce opportunities.
- 14 wards out of 15 were declared as child labour free in Chandragiri municipality.
- **6** policies, guidelines and plans developed and implemented at local level, which were supported by WVI Nepal.

Protection, Community Engagement and Sponsorship Plan

- **4,700** Registered Children (RC) sponsored in child sponsorship programme.
- **12** Micro projects implemented for meaningful participation of RC with the USD budget of **17**,688.
- **3,069** parents oriented on positive parenting to foster safer family environment for children.
- **1,993** adolescents from **67** Rupantaran groups trained on life and protective skills and engaged in the communities.
- **1,058** vulnerable children received need- based support through the reporting and referral (R&R) mechanism.
- 600 children and families provided with psycho-social support.
- **540** individuals supported to have access to government social protection schemes.
- 236 cases (86 child labor, 7 child sexual abuse and 143 others) managed proactively and confidentially through the case management system.
- **38** most vulnerable children received critical health support with medical provisions.
- 13 policies, guidelines and plans developed and implemented at local and provincial levels, which were supported by WVI Nepal.

One Local Child Rights Committee (LCRC) and 11 Ward Child Rights Committees (WCRCs) are actively functioning and managing cases and referral system effectively.

11 club networks and 50 community level child clubs are empowered and engaged through different initiatives on child rights, protection and raising awareness.

Ward # 7 of Kirtipur Municipality declared Child Friendly Local Governance.
