The BORDER Project

The BORDER Project aims to strengthen the resilience and social cohesion of these vulnerable populations. It targets five host communities: Zini, Tarikom, Issakatinga, Bansi and Fielmo, as well as two refugee settlements. The initiative is expected to directly benefit more than 19,000 people, including 5,765 Burkinabe refugees, and reach a further +33,000 people indirectly.

Mabel A. Adobor: Driving Change Through Child Sponsorship

Meet Mabel A. Adobor, our passionate Child Sponsorship Manager, whose work ensures that child sponsorship is not only well-managed but deeply meaningful. She leads the national strategy, integrating sponsorship into development programmes and promoting it as a life-changing relationship between children, families, communities, and sponsors.

One of Mabel's proudest moments was leading the implementation of Chosen, where 87 children selected their own sponsors for the first time. She recalls a major milestone organizing a Chosen event for 2,000 children in just one week, made possible by teamwork and dedication.

Mabel finds joy in engaging with vulnerable communities, educating families on the power of sponsorship. "It reminds me of God's goodness and my calling to serve," she shares.

Before joining World Vision, Mabel worked in training and development, an experience that sparked her desire to work in the humanitarian space. Today, she dreams of becoming an expert in Child Protection and Safeguarding, empowering children as agents of change.

Her motivation? The smiles of children whose lives are transformed through sponsorship and the opportunity to live out her faith while serving others.
