In Fiscal Year 2025, we have prioritized the strategic integration of Gifts in Kind (GIK) resources with our core program sectors, fostering collaborative partnerships to drive meaningful impact and achieve comprehensive child well-being objectives.

By leveraging GIK resources effectively, we aim to enhance the lives of children and families in need, advancing our mission to create lasting change and promote a brighter future for Zimbabwe's most vulnerable populations. This commitment has translated into tangible results, as a comprehensive humanitarian aid program has made a significant impact on the lives of over 295,000 beneficiaries by providing essential support in education, healthcare, water sanitation and hygiene, food security, and child protection, ultimately improving access to quality services and promoting overall well-being.

Education

GIK Beneficiaries: 196,553 students



Shipments: 4

- 4 shipments of school and office furniture comprising 25 cabinets, 596 chairs, 346 pieces of desks, 171 tables, 5 book cases.
- 1,590 Boxes ceramic tiles
- 1 shipment of 288 Mattresses
- 3,003 Backpacks
- 885 soccer balls
- 40,422 toys
- 2,400 water containers
- 748 assorted cookware
- 115 tents
- 300 sleeping bags
- 3,326 Sports towels
- 824 solar panels to schools

Impact

- Donated furniture helped create a comfortable and conducive learning environment, promoting better focus, engagement, and academic performance. Adequate and comfortable furniture helped to reduce distractions, promote better behavior, and encourage learners to develop good study habits.
- Donated mattresses provided essential support to vulnerable learners through enhancing sleep quality, leading to better rest, relaxation, and rejuvenation. This, in turn, improved cognitive function, concentration, and overall well-being of students.
- The backpacks provided learners with the necessary tools and resources to participate fully in their educational activities, promoting greater access to learning opportunities. Backpacks can be a significant expense for many families, particularly those from low-income backgrounds. The donation helped alleviate this financial burden, allowing families to allocate resources to other essential needs.





Maternal and Child Health

GIK Beneficiaries: 75,000



Shipments: 3

- 3 shipments of medical supplies comprising of 200 boxes Sponges, 432 boxes abdominal pads, 296 boxes lab coats, 329 boxes surgical kits, 24 examination beds, sanitary napkins, gloves, and masks, slippers for medical use, googles, and examination lab coats.

- 408 Plastic coolers to different Health Centers.
- 500 boxes of ceramic tile for newly constructed Health facility in Tshitshi Madabe AP.
- 76 tents

Impact

- The donation of these Gifts-in-Kind (GIK) to health centers is poised to have a transformative impact on the healthcare system and the communities served. The medical supplies, including sponges, abdominal pads, surgical kits, and personal protective equipment, enable healthcare workers to provide quality care, prevent infections, and promote better health outcomes. The plastic coolers ensure effective vaccine storage, supporting immunization programs and protecting communities from vaccine-preventable diseases. Additionally, the ceramic tiles for the newly constructed health facility in Tshitshi Madabe enhanced the infrastructure, creating a clean and hygienic environment for patients and healthcare workers. Overall, this donation strengthened the healthcare system, improving health outcomes, and increasing community trust, ultimately contributing to a healthier and more resilient community.

Impact

- Deepened faith and understanding of scriptures, fostering community discussions and spiritual growth.





Water Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH)

GIK Beneficiaries: 5,151



Shipments: 2

- 203 backpacks to community volunteers
- 2,989 Canvas totes
- 282 Beverage bottles
- 215 cookware
- 205 hygiene kits
- 800 water containers
- 577 water pitchers
- 2,585 plastic buckets / dish to community volunteers

Impact

- The donation had a transformative impact on promoting hygiene practices and improving access to clean water and sanitation. The backpacks for community volunteers empowered them to effectively engage with communities, while the canvas totes, beverage bottles, and water containers promoted eco-friendly practices, reduced single-use plastics, and provided a safe and reliable way to store and transport clean water. The cookware enabled communities to prepare nutritious meals, and the hygiene kits promoted personal hygiene practices, dignity, and well-being. Overall, this donation contributed to a comprehensive WASH program, improving health outcomes, increasing water security, and promoting overall well-being in the community.

Impact

- Enhanced project funding, stronger partnerships, and increased organizational visibility and credibility.





Food Security and Resilience

GIK Beneficiaries: 2,500



Shipments: 1

- 1 shipment of 75 bicycles which were distributed to FMR Champions
- 1 Shipment comprising of 20 pallets of ceramic tiles for refurbishing Hwange AP office and Child friendly space at suburbs office.

- 515 pieces of assortment of cookware
- Distributions: 492 plus 332 solar panels for sustainable agriculture and disaster risk reduction.
- 55 fabric rolls to schools for Fashion and Fabric subjects and community clubs

Impact

- The donations had a positive impact on food security and livelihoods. The 99 bicycles distributed to FMR Champions increased their mobility, enabling them to provide timely and effective support to communities, improving access to nutrition services. The refurbishment of the Hwange AP office and Child-friendly space with 20 pallets of ceramic tiles enhanced the infrastructure, creating a safe and welcoming environment for community members to access services and support. The donation of cookware enabled communities to prepare nutritious meals safely and efficiently, contributing to improved food security, health outcomes, and livelihoods. These efforts contributed to improved food security, nutrition, and livelihoods for vulnerable populations

GIK Beneficiaries: 15,000



Shipments: 2

- 2,970 synthetic light weight blankets
- 2,080 wrapping towels
- 5,859 plastic and aluminum beverage bottles
- 15,55 assorted cookware
- 152 tents

- 122 sleeping bags
- 14 bicycles for Village health workers
- 1,680 shopping cooler bags, 401 sanitary napkins
- 1,890 hygiene kits

Impact

- The donations had a significant impact on sponsored children, providing them with warmth, comfort, and improved living conditions. The synthetic lightweight blankets kept them warm, while the wrapping towels supported hygiene practices. The plastic and aluminum beverage bottles encouraged the use of clean drinking water, reducing waterborne illnesses. The cookware enabled caregivers to prepare nutritious meals safely, and the tents provided temporary shelter and protection. Additionally, the sleeping bags offered warmth and comfort, and the bicycles for Village Health Workers enabled them to reach remote areas, providing timely healthcare services to sponsored children and their communities.

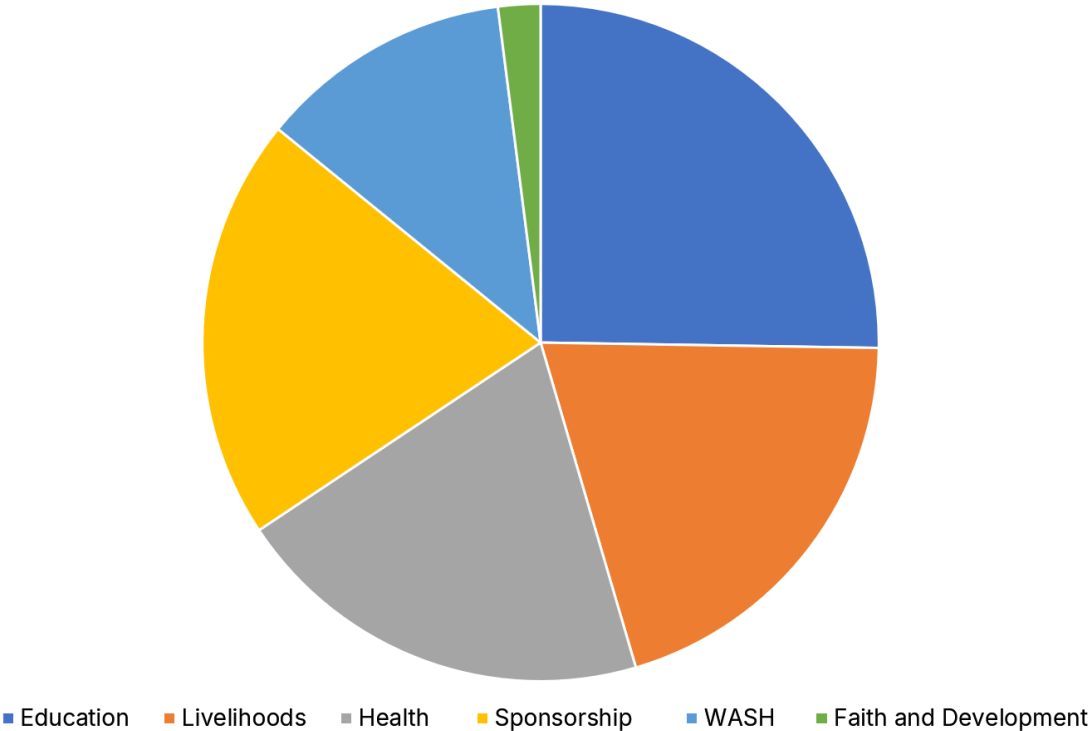




Conclusion

In FY2025, World Vision Zimbabwe effectively used Gifts in Kind (GIK) to strengthen child well-being across core program sectors. The distribution of support aligned with national priorities, with Education receiving the largest share (25%). Shipments of school furniture, backpacks, sports items, solar panels, and mattresses improved learning environments and benefited more than 196,000 students. Health and Livelihoods (20% each) were enhanced through medical supplies, PPE, examination beds, vaccine coolers, bicycles, cookware, and resilience materials, supporting over 75,000 people and boosting nutrition and service delivery. Sponsorship and Child Protection (20%) provided blankets, hygiene kits, sleeping bags, cookware, and tents to more than 15,000 children, improving safety, comfort, and hygiene. WASH inputs (12%) strengthened hygiene practices and water access for over 5,000 beneficiaries. Faith & Development (2%) and Disability support (1%) ensured spiritual growth and inclusion. Overall, GIK significantly expanded reach and improved living conditions for vulnerable communities.
