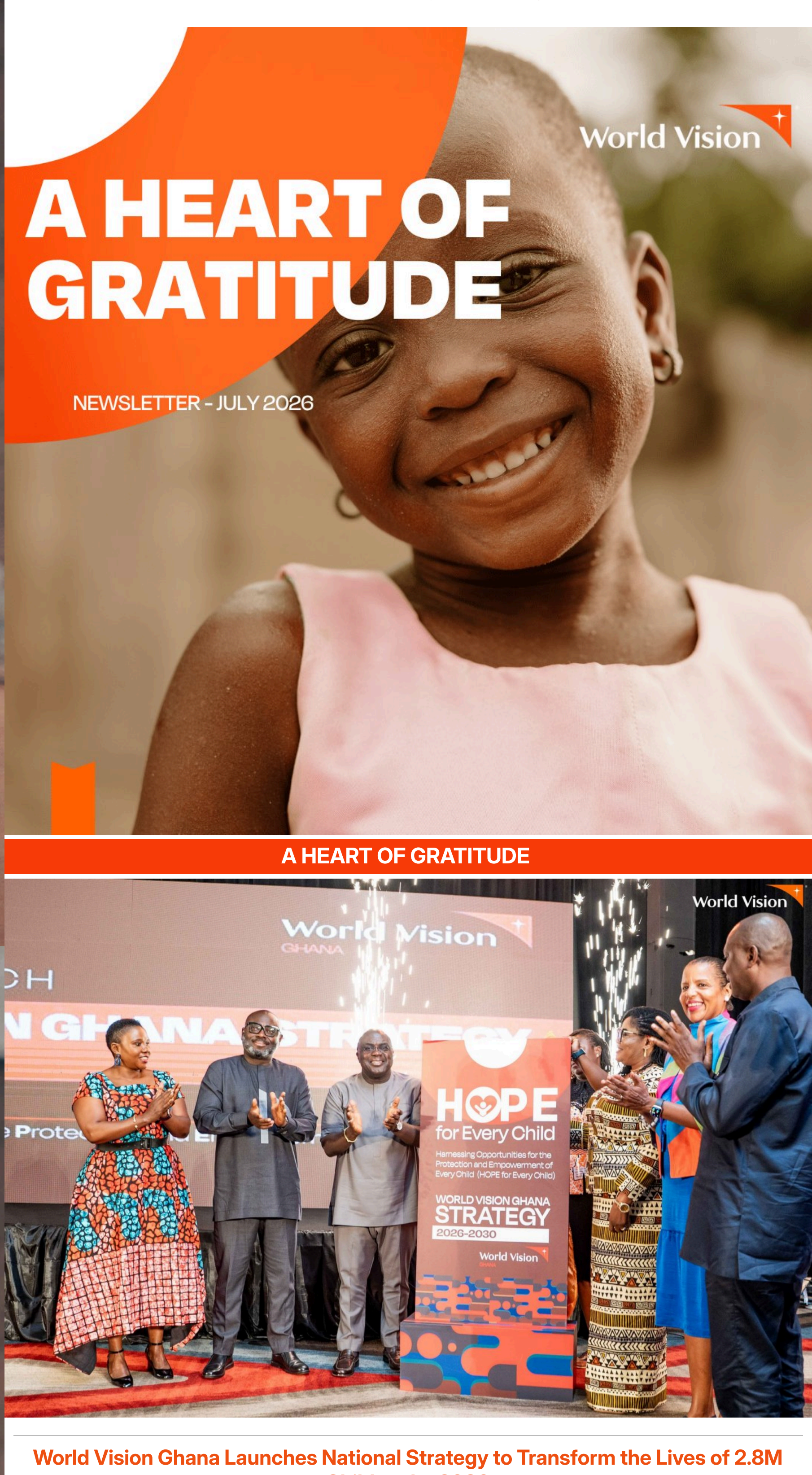




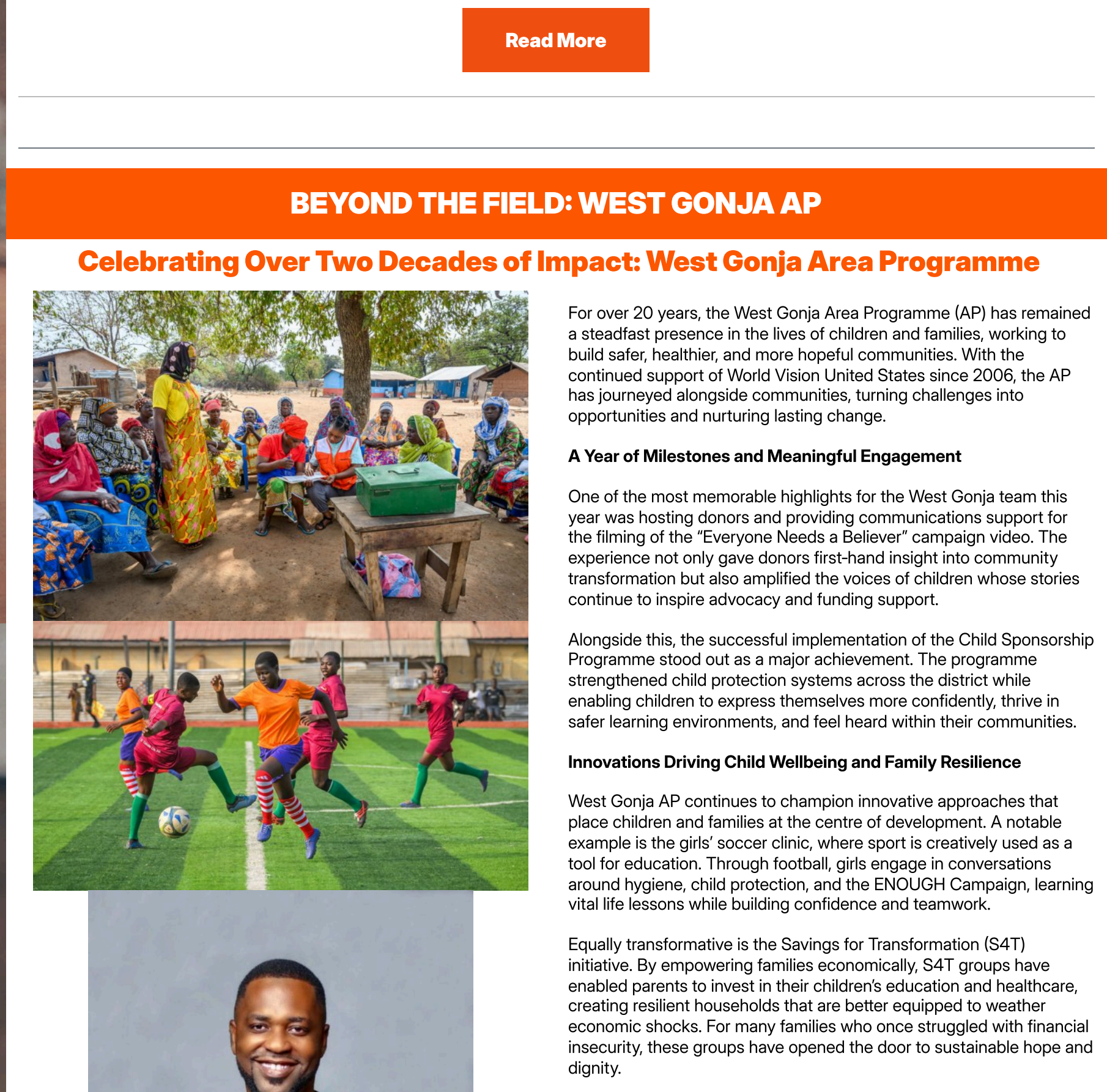

A Year of Milestones and Meaningful Engagement

One of the most memorable highlights for the West Gonja team this year was hosting donors and providing communications support for the filming of the "Everyone Needs a Believer" campaign video. The experience not only gave donors first-hand insight into community transformation but also amplified the voices of children whose stories continue to inspire advocacy and funding support.

Alongside this, the successful implementation of the Child Sponsorship Programme stood out as a major achievement. The programme strengthened child protection systems across the district while enabling children to express themselves more confidently, thrive in safer learning environments, and feel heard within their communities.

Innovations Driving Child Wellbeing and Family Resilience

West Gonja AP continues to champion innovative approaches that place children and families at the centre of development. A notable example is the girls' soccer clinic, where sport is creatively used as a tool for education. Through football, girls engage in conversations around hygiene, child protection, and the ENOUGH Campaign, learning vital life lessons while building confidence and teamwork.

Equally transformative is the Savings for Transformation (S4T) initiative. By empowering families economically, S4T groups have enabled parents to invest in their children's education and healthcare, creating resilient households that are better equipped to weather economic shocks. For many families who once struggled with financial insecurity, these groups have opened the door to sustainable hope and dignity.

Recognising Challenges, Strengthening Resolve

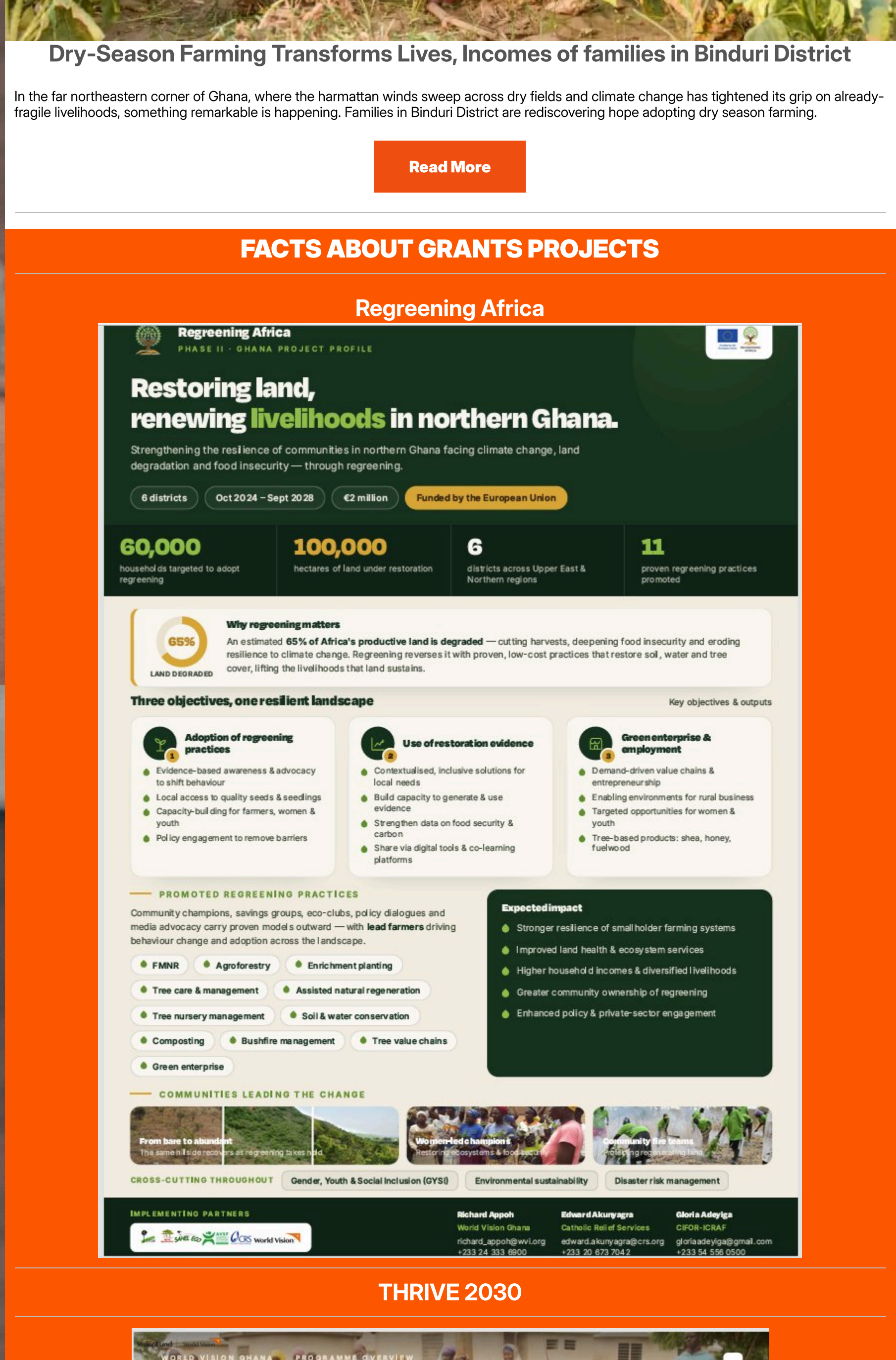

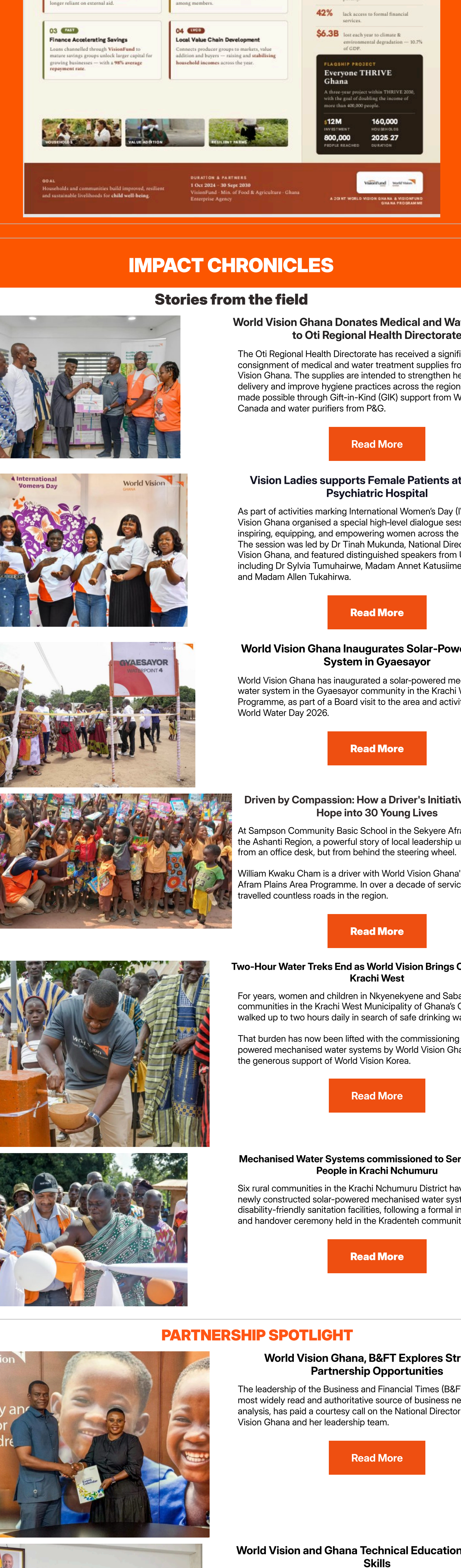
Dry-Season Farming thrives in Binduri District

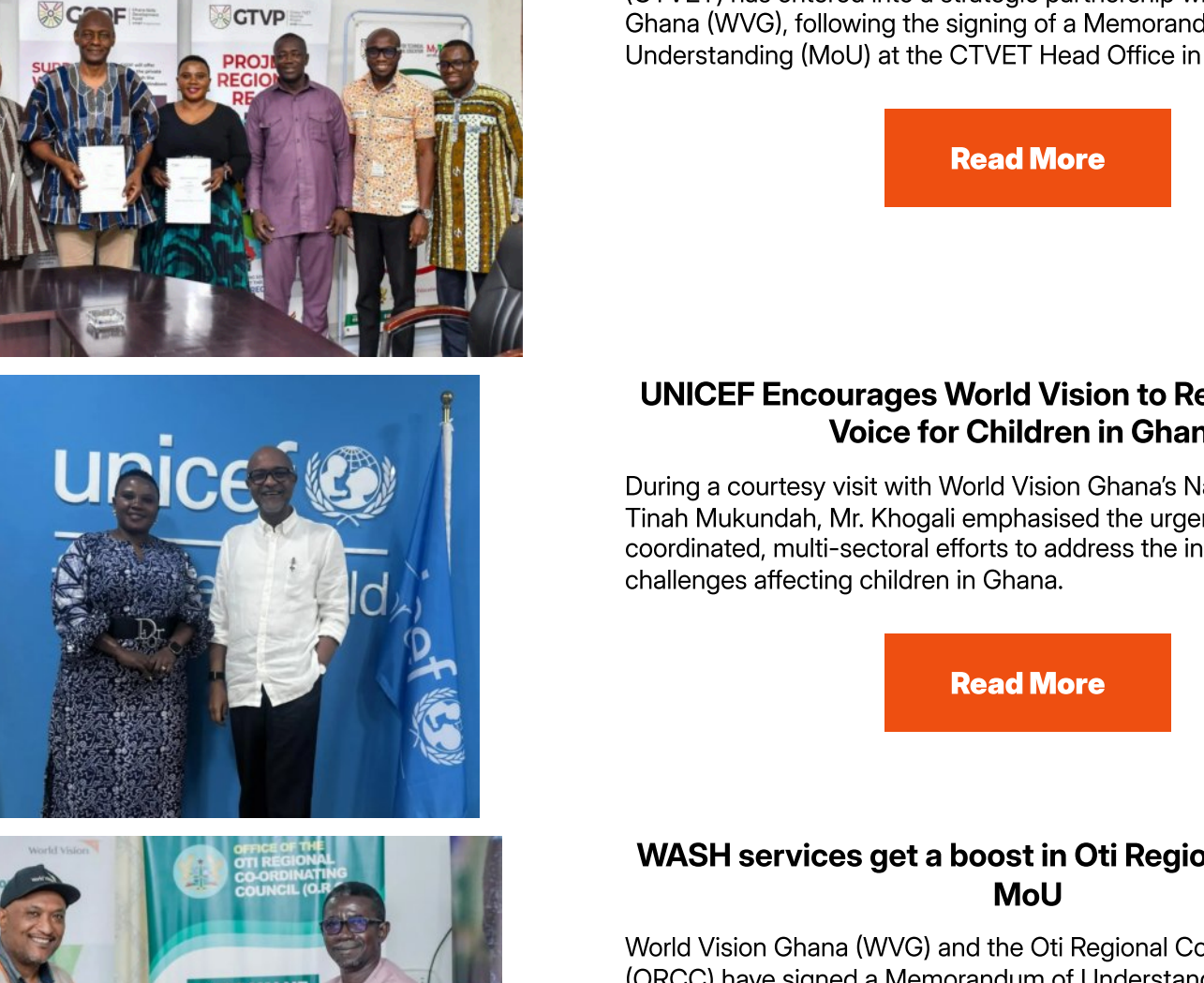

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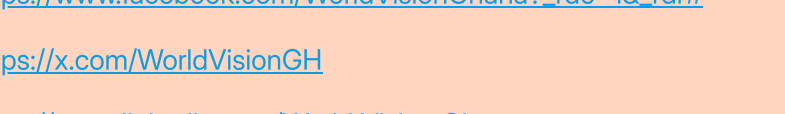
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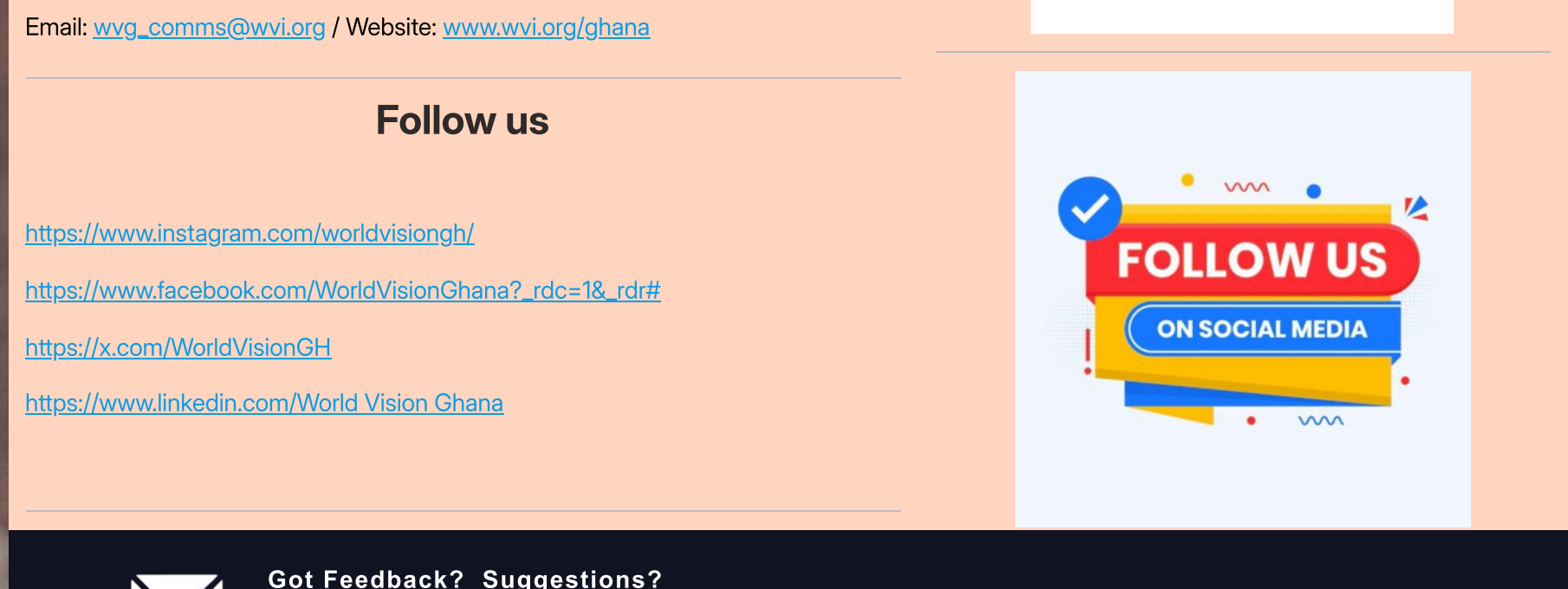
