Who We Are

World Vision International Myanmar (WVIM) is one of the longest-serving humanitarian and development organization in Myanmar, with more than three decades of operational presence across both stable and conflict-affected contexts. We partner closely with government ministries, civil society, faith-based groups, local leaders, and communities to deliver integrated programs in education, child protection, health and nutrition, WASH, livelihoods, and disaster response. Our locally rooted teams ensure culturally relevant, community-owned solutions that support children to thrive. In livelihood, our work focuses on strengthening household resilience, restoring livelihoods, and protecting the well-being of vulnerable children through integrated, community-driven approaches that address both immediate needs and long-term recovery. Each year, our programmes reach millions, reflecting our commitment to ensure children are educated, protected, and cared for in safe and resilient communities.

Our Value Proposition

At WVIM, our livelihood technical team has a longstanding experience in agriculture, livestock production, vocational training, value chain development, business development, savings for transformation, and natural resources management, with a particular focus on climate-smart agriculture.

By forging robust collaborations with key stakeholders, we implement innovative and adaptable globally recognized approaches and customized livelihood models tailored to the unique needs of the local context, promoting sustainable practices and building resilience against climate change.

Our efforts are supported by World Vision's regional and global expertise in livelihood and economic development, poverty reduction, climate resilience, and quality effectiveness. Through the comprehensive approach and cutting-edge livelihood solutions, we ensure long-term sustainability and food security for the vulnerable communities and children we serve.

Where We Work



We deliver Resilience and Livelihoods in 32 townships in 5 Regions and 6 States.

Main Resilience and Livelihoods Interventions

We **empower vulnerable families** through sustainable livelihood solutions, climate-smart income generation, and natural resource management that enhance long-term productivity. By reducing poverty and strengthening resilience, we create lasting stability and expanded opportunities for both adults and children.

We focus on **promoting savings for transformation and inclusive market system development** to build community financial resilience by improving household incomes and food security, with special attention to women, thus communities become better equipped to withstand economic shocks.

We deliver **context-specific livelihood initiatives** that diversify incomes and strengthen community resilience across townships. We also build partnerships that reinforce local value chains and expand income-generating opportunities, particularly in dry-zone areas, creating a more enabling environment for sustainable local enterprise growth.

Tools and Approaches

Improved Income Adequacy, Security and Resilience

We strengthen the capacity of vulnerable groups—including women, youth, and persons with disabilities

—to increase household income through climate-smart agriculture, micro-irrigation, and high-value crops. We provide vocational training, develop inclusive market systems and local value chains, and support SME start-ups. We also expand access to credit through microfinance partners and apply Empowered Worldview—a behaviour change approach—to promote mindset change and personal empowerment.

Saving for Transformation (S4T)

Our S4T groups—largely led by women—promote voluntary savings and credit access that strengthen financial inclusion, peacebuilding, and social cohesion. Members obtain quick loans for enterprise growth and essential needs, improving their repayment capacity and expanding their economic opportunities.

Regreening Communities

We integrate climate-smart agriculture and natural resource management to improve food and nutrition security through sustainable farming and livestock practices. Using Farmer Managed Natural Regeneration (FMNR), communities restore degraded land and build resilience while promoting bio-composting, efficient water use, and tree planting to enhance biodiversity and reduce emissions.

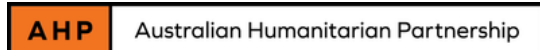
Our Partners
