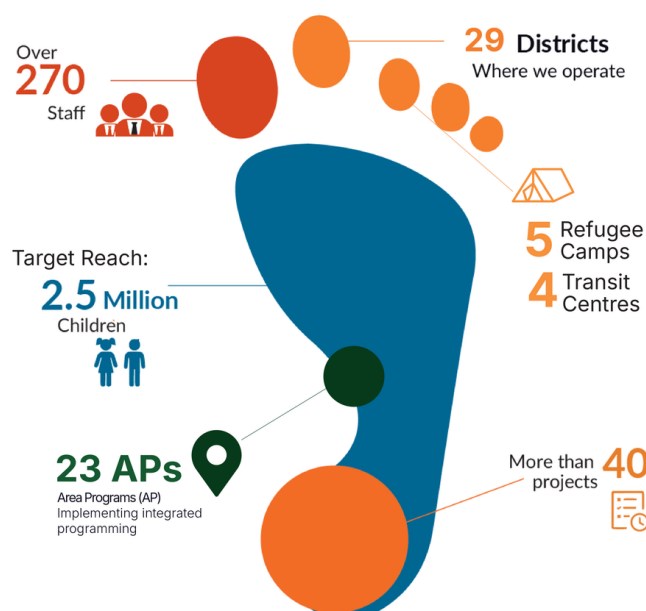

Background

World Vision Rwanda is implementing its 2026–2030 Strategy to improve the well-being of 2.5 million vulnerable children through integrated, community-led development, working in partnership with the Government of Rwanda, communities, donors, and other development partners.

The strategy is implemented through the Kura Neza Integrated Programme Framework (Kura Neza IPF), meaning "Full Life Development." The framework integrates interventions in child protection, education, health and nutrition, WASH, climate action, and resilience and livelihoods to achieve sustainable outcomes for children and communities.
