Sustainable Development


 Meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs (Our Common Future; Brundtland Report 1987)

- 7 environmental
- 6 economic

Social organisation — environmental care & repair — economic growth



Key social benefits

- Creates a positive & hopeful community
- Builds collaboration, networks and partnerships
- Fosters tree ownership and land tenure security for farmers
- Increases education and training
- Increases empowerment for women
- Increases food security, health and resilience



Key environmental benefits

- Restores tree cover
- Reduces erosion
- Enriches soils
- Increases water availability
- Controls wind and temperatures
- Increases biodiversity
- Climate change adaptation and mitigation



Key economic benefits

- Increases incomes through:
 - improved crop yields
 - sale of tree products
 - improved livestock production
- Increases household assets
- Increases consumables/decreases expenditures
- Offers new income opportunities via carbon credit revenues
