WORLD VISION EAST AFRICA HUNGER RESPONSE SITUATION REPORT NO.6

14 JUNE 2017



KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- Number of Affected Expected to Grow: Below-average seasonal rains and a fall armyworm invasion have raised concern about a likely increase in the number of people in need. Currently, 25 million people are in need of humanitarian assistance. However, with low rainfalls and the destruction of crops due to fall armyworm, harvest are likely to be low and the number of people who are food insecure is expected to grow.
- More People Displaced: Continuing conflict and prolonged drought has led to an increase in the number of people displaced. New statistics state that a total of 5.2 million people have been displaced 3.6 million in South Sudan, 848,400 in Ethiopia, 714,000 in Somalia and 38,600 in the Kenyan counties of Isiolo and Baringo.
- Cholera and Acute Watery Diarrhea
 Outbreak: The number of people

- affected by waterborne diseases is growing, with more than 75,000 cases of acute watery diarrhea (AWD) and cholera reported across the four countries this year.
- One in Three Children Malnourished: In parts of Kenya, Ethiopia, South Sudan and Somalia, the number of children under age 5 who are malnourished is as high as 30%. Nearly 850,000 children under age 5 have been identified as severely malnourished and are at risk of death without intervention.
- Ongoing Response Continues: World Vision is responding to conflict and drought. More than 1.5 million people have been assisted through programs that deliver food assistance, provide protection services, ensure communities have clean water, address child and maternal nutrition and meet other crucial needs.

HUMANITARIAN SITUATION OVERVIEW

Ethiopia: Children in drought affected communities are at increased risk of malnutrition as food pipeline is breaking. Ethiopia Humanitarian Country Team have officially expressed their concerns to donors about the gap in food and nutritional needs. The concern is that from starting in July, Ethiopia will run out of emergency food aid and will not able to provide food for 7.8 million people currently receiving food assistance. The Humanitarian Country Team requests international aid worth US \$55 million to support the treatment of malnourished children from July to the end of the year and US \$500 million to purchase and transport food assistance for an estimated 8 million people who are expected to be in urgent need of food assistance in the next six months.

Kenya: World Vision and partner agencies screened 42,017 children for malnutrition in six counties (Turkana, Marsabit, Wajir, Isiolo, Kilifi and Laikipia). A total of 29.4% were diagnosed as moderately malnourished while 6% were identified as severely malnourished. Additional data received in May from Baringo (East Pokot sub-county), Samburu and Tana River counties revealed 23.4% of children were moderately malnourished and 6.3% were acutely malnourished, of 764 children screened.

Somalia: The humanitarian situation continues to deteriorate in most regions of Puntland, Somaliland, Jubaland and South West State. According to the FSNAU Food Security Alert of May 2017, the pasture and water shortage and significant loss of livestock in north-eastern and central regions, worsens the already precarious situation. A typical livestock offtake, accumulated debts, destitution and displacements have characterised most of the livelihoods zones and communities.

South Sudan: Over the past weeks new Cholera alerts were reported in Don Bosco IDP site in Juba with cases of cholera recently confirmed in Madol cattle camp in Rumbek North. The current update cumulatively sums up to 8,160 cholera cases, 248 deaths and a Case Fatality Rate of 3.1% across 19 counties by 15 May. Active transmission is reported in seven counties: Yirol East and Yirol West, Bor, Duk, Kapoeta South, Kapoeta North, and Kapoeta East.


