

World Vision Pray to End Famine

Talking Points

More people face famine today than any time in modern history.

Our world is experiencing a hunger crisis so severe that in 2017, the United Nations is called it "the largest humanitarian crisis since 1945." Areas of Nigeria, South Sudan, Somalia and Yemen are on the brink of famine due to drought and conflict. More than 20 million people risk starvation and an estimated 1.4 million children are severely malnourished.

Conflict and violence are the key driver for hunger and food insecurity around the world. Across 18 countries, conflict has left 74 million people face high levels of food insecurity. War and conflict also cause millions of people to flee becoming displaced in their own country or refugees in a neighbouring country. These displaced communities in Uganda, Ethiopia, Democratic Republic of Congo, Syria and Bangladesh often require food assistance to survive. This is a global crisis.

The world is not responding quickly enough and the window of time to save lives is closing.

The famine and hunger crisis are not hitting the news the way that it should. With all the other issues affecting our world today, one could understand how the looming famines and surrounding hunger crisis isn't getting the media coverage it deserves—and yet millions are already at risk of dying.

Now more than ever, the Church needs to come together to pray and respond to those in need.

Churches have a prophetic role in calling its members, wider society and governments to make a difference during this unprecedented period of suffering. In 2017, World Vision joined a broad coalition of more than 120 faith-based organisations, representing more than 1 billion Christians worldwide, because we recognised the urgent need to make the famine and hunger crisis more widely known through our prayers and actions.

The Global Day of Prayer to End Famine in May 2017 was effective in raising awareness and encouraging action to be taken. Positive steps forward were made, but hunger remains and lives are still on the line.

On 10 June 2018, World Vision is again joining the coalition in a Global Day of Prayer to End Famine.
