#### World Vision in Rwanda

World Vision began working in Rwanda in 1994, as millions fled after the genocide started. Initially, World Vision provided emergency help to those displaced, and care for unaccompanied children, and then helped people resettle as they returned home. Since 2000, World Vision has been working with communities in Rwanda to find long-term solutions to poverty and injustice.

#### Number of sponsored children

Currently, World Vision Rwanda sponsors 84,300 children in its 29 Area Development Programs located in 21 districts

#### Number of beneficiaries

World Vision Rwanda is directly supporting 1,200,000 people through 29 long-term child-focused Area Development Programmes (ADPs) and special projects, all located in 21 out of the 30 Rwandan districts. Our programming is currently reaching out to 2.5 million people.

World Vision Rwanda employs 360 staff members serving in the ministry at various levels i.e. National Office, Zonal Offices, ADPs, grants and special projects across the country.
